TEEN ISSUES DAY On November 12th, all B.D.H.S. students participated in TEEN ISSUES DAY. Organized by Mrs. Loretta Metz (Chairwoman of the Religion Department), the programs intent was for students and guest speakers to address issues related to adolescent development. Topics discussed included: Drug & Alcohol abuse, Self Esteem, Teen Depression, Teen Pregnancy, Abortion, Teen Suicide, AIDS, Rape and Date Rape and Sexually Transmitted Diseases. Speakers from the local community along with State officials were our guest for the event.

CURRICULUM EXPANDED Thanks to the generosity of a local car dealership, B.D. is offering a Driver Education class for the first time in school history. Sam Yanen Ford of Moundsville has graciously provided the vehicle for our use and the program has received approval from the WV Department of Education.

The Religion department, under the guidance of Mrs. Loretta Metz, has expanded the community service project that began last year. Beginning in 1993-94, each student will be required to participate in this program.

The Art Department is offering Multimedia Art, an introduction into several types of art design and structure.

A College and Career Center, intended for all students is being erected in the library. Numerous resources will be available to all students as will a computer and large college database.

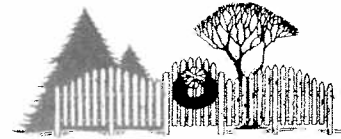

They used it to establish a scholarship fund in Conti's memory.

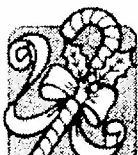
